ENTRY FORM DEADLINE - Friday, July 10

ENTRY FEE - \$5.00 per member for each club of which they are a member

PRIZE MONEY - In lieu of prize money, members will receive \$9.00 per division. Members must participate in showmanship competition to be eligible for prize money.

PASSES

All passes must be purchased in advance and should be ordered with the club entry. Passes will not be available for purchase at the exhibition.

LEADERS: Each club will receive 2 free leader passes for the first 10 members and 1 additional leader pass for each additional 6 members.

MEMBERS: each 4-H member who is entered in a class at the Exhibition will receive one bracelet for free admission.

PARENTS: 4-H parents may purchase a 3 day exhibitor pass for \$20 each.

PARKING: all parking except overnight RV/tent parking will be **FREE in 2008.**

- Overnight RV/tent parking.....\$15.00 per night

Overnight Parking – located inside the oval. Enter via the Exhibitors entrance on Lickman Rd. Please request overnight parking on the club entry form and you will be allotted numbered parking spaces. Any vehicles which will be moving in and out during the fair must be parked in the public parking lot. Anyone who wishes to arrive before noon Thursday must make prior arrangements. - All entries are to be made by the Club Leader and must be on a Club Entry form.
- Entries will be accepted on a first come basis until accommodations are full. **Early entries are advisable.**
- Please indicate club entries on your entry form.
- **Awards** will be presented to Junior, Intermediate & Senior Champion and Reserve Champion Showman in most 4-H Sections.

ALL EXHIBITORS, INCLUDING 4-H MEMBERS ARE BOUND BY THE RULES PRINTED AT THE FRONT OF THIS BOOK. EXHIBITORS AND 4-H MEMBERS SHOULD READ AND BECOME FAMILIAR WITH THEM.

1. Open to members of all 4-H clubs recognized by the B.C. Provincial 4-H Council.
2. All 4-H projects, including Educational Displays must be in place by 8:00 a.m. Friday, August 7, 2009 except Non Livestock which must be in place between noon and 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 7.
3. All exhibits must remain until release time at 6:00 p.m., Sunday, August 9, 2009. 4-H clubs from outside the Fraser Valley may be released earlier only **by written request at time of entry.**
4. **Absolutely no displays may come down before 6:00 p.m. Sunday. Clubs that do not comply will forfeit prizes.**
5. B.C. Provincial 4-H Council rules apply.
6. A \$5.00 entry fee per member per club is required.
7. Each project must be entered on a separate entry form with a cheque attached to each entry form.
8. There must be at least 4 members entered in one project to have a competition for that project.
9. Entries may be checked for proper identification
10. Showmanship competition – showmanship will be judged Danish system. Exhibitors to use their club entry in the competition. Judging is to be done on the basis of:
 - 70% - showing
 - 20% - conditioning
 - 10% - appearance of handlerIt's understood that all three placings should be used where possible, but final decision is at the discretion of the judge.
11. **Project Competition – a member is only eligible to take part if he or she has shown in the Showmanship Competition.** Project classes will be judged Danish System. Exhibitors to use their club entry in this competition. It is understood that all three placings should be used where possible but the final decision is at the discretion of the judge.
12. **Members must show their own project in both project and showmanship class.**
13. Any clipping or grooming of the 4-H animal at the fair must be done by the 4-H member themselves and must not be done by an adult or leader or that animal will be disqualified.
14. **ATTIRE** - all 4-H members and supervising leaders must appear in suitable dress at all times. In the show ring, members must be correctly attired for the class in question.
15. **CONDUCT** - SAD rules apply. Any 4-H member consuming alcohol or under the influence of alcohol/drugs or exhibiting in improper fashion will be barred from competition and may forfeit any prize money that has been awarded.

These rules are in addition to those stated in the General Rules and Regulations at the front of this prize list. Contestants are responsible for reading and abiding by them.

1. Each member must be covered by liability insurance such as 4-H, 24 hour school insurance, or Horse Council of B.C. Liability Insurance.

2. Members must submit parent release forms to the Leaders. No one under age 9.

3. Animals must be current year's project. No substitutions without a vet's certificate and Council of 4-H Horse Leaders permission.

4. Horses may be inspected for infectious diseases by the appropriate committee members and the barn superintendent. This committee has the authority to disqualify any infected animal and demand the immediate removal of the animal from the exhibition grounds. In the event of any dispute, a veterinarian will be called and any expense incurred shall be at the expenses of the party in error.

5. Hard Hats and boots are mandatory when mounted.

6. Must show in showmanship or forfeit prize money.

Showmanship and Equitation will be judged Danish system. Other classes will be judged straight line with ribbons to sixth place. Classes may be divided or combined if warranted.
